### SB1421 Summary, 2017

Pursuant to Penal Code §832.7(A)(i), the following records pertain to an incident involving the discharge of a firearm at a person by a peace officer or custodial officer.

\* Pursuant to California Penal Code § 832.7(b)(7)(A)(iii), criminal charges are pending in this matter and disclosure could reasonably be expected to interfere with criminal proceedings against someone other than the officer who used force. Released information will be delayed until there is a verdict issued in a trial or a plea of guilty or no contest is entered. No estimate for release is available at this time, however, this case will be re-evaluated every 180 days, until such time as the information contained shall be released.

Pursuant to Penal Code §832.7(A)(ii), the following records pertain to incidents in which the use of force by a peace officer or custodial officer against a person resulted in death, or in great bodily injury.
