7. BUSINESS

A. APPOINT SUB-COMMITTEE FOR POTENTIAL COMMUNITY DESIGNED PUBLIC ART AT TROWER PARK

- The project, with an overall budget of \$3.18 million, is centered around the new theme of "Culture Meets Nature."
- Art in the Park, will feature several artistic elements, including surface murals on basketball courts, skate parks, and mist pads, as well as tile art on low walls. Additionally, 2-3 mystical creature sculptures designed by the community will be installed.
- To facilitate this, Chair Fox will appoint 2-4 public members with a background in the arts to the Project Committee.

- This committee will solicit and review design submissions from the community.
- A grant application has been submitted to Art in California Parks for \$220,000, with grant award notification anticipated in September 2024.
- The project timeline includes coordinating with construction during Fall/Winter 2024/25, installing surface murals during the construction period, and placing tile art and sculptures following park renovations.

ACTION: Appoint two (2) members of the Arts Advisory Committee to serve on a Project Committee for the selection of public art designs for the Trower Park Improvement Project.

Chair Fox and Vice Chair Bates volunteered with Committee Member Salfiti as an alternate.

B. “LABYRINTHINE HEART” BY WENDY ACKRELL – DONATION TO THE CITY OF VACAVILLE’S PUBLIC ART COLLECTION

- Created by Wendy Ackrell, a San Francisco-based artist, this heart is one of 31 featured in the Hearts in San Francisco 2023 event.
- Acquired by Genentech, it is currently displayed in Union Square, San Francisco.
- Genentech has generously offered to cover the costs of relocating and installing the piece as a donation to the Public Art Collection.
- The committee has proposed several potential placement sites, which will be reviewed by staff in consultation with Public Works.

C. “TOUCH THE SKY” BY MARTIN TAYLOR – TEMPORARY INSTALLATION

- The Downtown Vacaville Business Improvement District (DVBID) is presenting a new initiative aimed at enhancing the downtown area and attracting more visitors.
- A sculpture, measuring 14.6' x 9.25' x 16.25', will be installed on the School Street Bridge to Carroll Plaza and Andrews Park from July 2024 to June 2025.
- The total cost of the project is \$6,500, with \$2,500 allocated from the Non-Departmental Expenditure Account.

A. VPAT SHOW SELECTION COMMITTEE

Committee Member Salfiti shared that they are continuing to hold online meetings and have confirmed four upcoming shows: Jimmy Vaugh and the Tilt-a-Whirl Band, Nick Carter, Shawn Colvin with KT Tunstall, and Serial Killers featuring Dr. Scott Bonn. Currently, there are efforts underway to bring in a multicultural jazz band.

B. VACAVILLE ARTS AND CULTURAL ALLIANCE

Committee member Salfiti represented Chair Fox at the Vacaville Arts and Cultural Alliance meeting. She shared that the group focused on introductions, networking, and future planning. They created a calendar for upcoming events and discussed feedback on past events. Meetings will be held every three months.

C. NEW PUBLIC ART PURCHASE

Chair Fox and Committee Member Robinson announced the acquisition of three new art pieces selected from the Vacaville Art League and Gallery's Juried Show in June. They utilized the remaining \$1,851 from the Non-Departmental Expenditure Account, along with \$255.03 from the Public Art Trust Fund, to make these purchases.

- *Deep Roots* by Pete Fala – Acrylic \$800 + tax = \$865
- *Brown's Valley* by Jessica Bergler – Oil \$900 + tax = \$973.13
- *Old Tree, New Poppies* by JS (Steve) Hartley – Photo \$248 + tax = \$268.15

9. REPORT OF RECREATION MANAGER

A. ARTS AND CULTURE MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Community workshops will begin on August 2 at CreekWalk, focusing on creating a Community Tapestry and a film for a reimagined version of the opera "Carmen." These efforts will incorporate modern community perspectives and involve stakeholder meetings for broad collaboration. Initial outreach, including a survey, will help shape the project, while a review of policies will ensure best practices are followed. Local artist Angela Arteritano will be contracted for her expertise, and plans are in place to encourage active community participation.

B. COW SCULPTURE PROJECT UPDATE

The committee reviewed the mockup of the plaque and provided feedback on its layout. A decision from Visit Vacaville will determine whether "Untitled" by Kathleen S. Farros will enter a naming contest or retain the name "Peaches," which she originally chose.

C. ARTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBER UPDATE

Committee Member Schulman has recently resigned from her position on the Arts Advisory Committee. The Department has posted a recruitment; those interested in applying are invited to submit their applications by July 28, 2024.

The Vacaville Jazz Society will hold Jazz Workshops, dancers and various high school bands will be attending and performing throughout the day at Vacaville Performing Art Theater from 11am to 5pm. "Viva Santana Show" will perform from 7pm to 9pm. Chair Fox is coordinating vendors and artists in the courtyard, with Joyful Art already reaching out to participate.

ACTION FOR CONSIDERATION:

Recommend the acceptance of the community tapestry, “Weaving our Future,” by Angela Arteritano, into the Public Art Collection and discuss installation location.

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend acceptance of the proposed artwork into the Public Art Collection and discuss placement recommendations.

BACKGROUND:

As part of the development of the Vacaville Arts and Culture Master Plan, the City of Vacaville, in partnership with local artist Angela Arteritano, led a series of community workshops where residents expressed their vision for the City’s future arts scene through words and drawings. Arteritano combined these artistic contributions using painting and punch needling techniques to create a tapestry titled “Weaving Our Future”. This artwork was integrated into a multimedia experience of a short dance film that delves into the themes of belonging and community, adding to the narrative portrayed on stage during her adaptation of “Carmen” performed at the Vacaville Performing Arts Theatre (VPAT) from September 27-29, 2024.

DISCUSSION:

The tapestry was displayed in the lobby of VPAT during the recent performances of “Carmen”. The event catered a special performance for youth, and attracted a diverse audience, with many attendees expressing admiration for the artwork. Exploring alternative locations for the tapestry’s display is recommended to further engage residents and to allow VPAT to continue to display diverse works of art in their lobby.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Amount Requested: None

Funding Sources: If necessary, the funding for the installation of the piece will be drawn from the Maintenance, Relocation, and Removal Fund (2030.25.2529.611) to cover any necessary supplies. The installation will be carried out by our in-house maintenance staff. Value of the art piece is \$10,000. This work is covered under the Arts and Culture Master Plan Budget (2095.25.2541.331). Arteritano was sub-contracted for her work at a rate of \$15,000.
