Visitors to the Peña Adobe Park on Saturday will be able to tour the national and state recognized historic adobe and the Mowers-Goheen museum. The museum houses a fascinating mix of local rocks and minerals, mastodon bones, period furniture, and archeological artifacts. Our friendly and knowledgeable volunteer docents will be on hand to answer questions and provide insight into Vacaville’s past. Come say ‘hello’ to our special guest, Little Bear, as he shows you Native American tools and artifacts.

Bring a picnic, play games, take a hike, and learn about the people that inhabited the region in the past. This is definitely a kid-friendly event with activities, stories, and refreshments. There is no charge for admission into the park and the event is free to all.
